# About Us



## History of the Governor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP)

The former Governor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) was established in 1968 to provide funding for criminal justice and victim assistance programs.

OCJP was abolished in the 2003 State Budget Act (Section 25.00) on December 31, 2003. All of the programs, with the exception of those in the Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention Branch (which transferred to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation), were incorporated into the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES).



# Our Second Home....

## History of OES



- The Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES) was established as part of the Governor's Office in 1950 as the State Office of Civil Defense. In 1956, the agency became involved in natural disaster operations; the name was changed to the California Disaster Office.
- Adoption of the State's Emergency Services Act in 1970 changed the agency's name to the Governor's Office of Emergency Services.



# January 1, 2009

## California Emergency Management Agency (Cal EMA)

- **Senate Bill 38** - Governor Schwarzenegger signed legislation that strengthens the state's ability to respond to emergencies and natural disasters. Assembly Bill 38 merged the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES) and Office of Homeland Security (OHS) into a single, streamlined cabinet-level agency and legislation that enhances emergency assistance to disaster victims.


# Criminal Justice Programs





**Title II - Formula Grants Program**

Created as a result of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (JJDP) Act of 2002, the Formula Grants program supports state and local delinquency prevention and intervention efforts and juvenile justice system improvements. After Congress appropriates funds, the [Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention](#) (OJJDP) awards formula grants to states based on their proportionate population under age 18. At least two-thirds of the funds awarded to each state must be used for programs operated by local public and private agencies and federally recognized tribal governments. These funds must be distributed on a competitive basis.

As the administering agency for the Title II Formula Grants program, the CSA is responsible for the development and submission of a three-year State Plan that identifies California's prioritized juvenile justice needs. The JJDP Act requires that the [State Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention](#) (SACJJD) participate in development of the State Plan.

Toward this end, the SACJJD members were sent a survey soliciting their input on California's juvenile justice priorities. Based on the responses of the members and staff's analysis of juvenile delinquency data, the State Plan (2006-2008) identifies five priority areas for funding locally developed projects with Title II monies: mental health services; gender-specific services; gang prevention/intervention; substance abuse treatment; and aftercare/re-entry services. Additionally, each year an update to the three-year plan must be

## School Community Violence Prevention

**NOTE: The application due date for this program has passed.**

The School Community Violence Prevention Program provides grants of up to \$500,000 for a five-year period for school districts or county offices of education wishing to address school safety and violence prevention issues. Approximately 10 percent of the funds will be awarded to quality projects from rural school districts in California. New this year will be an additional set aside of 20 percent for quality projects that focus on gang violence prevention. Applicants are required to submit a Request to Apply, which includes portions of the school safety plan from each site identified in the grant application. **The Request to Apply is due December 14, 2007 by 5 p.m. Questions must be submitted in writing only to Stephanie Papas at [spapas@cde.ca.gov](mailto:spapas@cde.ca.gov). As a grant funding entity, OES Division of Law Enforcement and Victim Services has the authority, with legislative enactment, and/or budget language, to provide available funds to state and local agencies, a non profit organizations to address a particular criminal justice or victim service issue. One process to awards is a Request for Proposals (RFPs). This is a competitive process that begins with the development of a program with a set of guidelines that clearly state the need for the program; the funds available; the objectives; the performance outcomes anticipated; and a timeline that lends itself to the fulfillment of the stated objectives. The number of eligible recipients may exceed the available funds, applicants must submit a proposal that meets the program compliance and the ability to meet and achieve the stated objectives. Each proposal is given a score. Funds are then awarded to the most qualified applicants with the highest scores.

A Request for Applications (RFA) is a process used to award grant funds to eligible recipients without a competitive application. This process is the same as the RFP definition stated above, however all applicants who meet the minimum qualifications for funding will receive an award. An example of this process is for such

The California Emergency Management Agency (Cal EMA), Law Enforcement and Victim Services Division, anticipates releasing the RFP for the Probation Specialized Units Recovery Act (PR) Program by June 15, 2009. This grant program is authorized by Public Law 111-5: The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (the "Recovery Act"). The goal of the program is to enhance or create specialized units within probation departments in California to intensively supervise small caseloads focusing strictly on sexual assault offenders. Eligible applicants include probation departments currently receiving funds from the Probation Specialized Unit Program (PU).

There is \$1,196,893 available for the PR Program; Cal EMA anticipates funding approximately seven projects ranging from \$100,000 to \$200,000 each, based on service area population, with a twenty-five percent (25%) match requirement. Each project will receive funding for twelve months beginning October 1, 2009 and ending on September 30, 2010.

On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed into law the landmark American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act). As one of its many elements, the Recovery Act provides the U.S. Department of Justice with funding for grants to assist state, local, and tribal law enforcement (including support for hiring) to combat violence against women, to fight internet crimes against children, to improve the functioning of the criminal justice system, to assist victims of crimes, and to support youth mentoring.

The CalEMA's Law Enforcement and Victim Services Division is soliciting proposals from qualified applicants to enhance or create specialized units to respond to reports of sexual assault. Approximately \$1,196,000 is available for the Sexual Assault Specialized Investigation Unit Program through the federal Recovery Act Services\*Training\*Officers\*Prosecutors (STOP) Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program.

The funding for this program is 18 months; beginning September 1, 2009 and ending February 28, 2011. Since this program is supported with one-time Recovery Act STOP Violence Against Women Formula Grant funds, continuation funding will not be available.

The Sexual Assault Section houses four programs that include such services as crisis counseling, education and/or training on issues affecting a variety of crime victims, and substantial support of 84 Rape Crisis Centers. These programs are supported State General Funds, State Victim Witness Assistance, federal Victims of Crime Act, and federal Violence Against Women Act funds totaling approximately \$15.4 million for FY2008/09

[Domestic Violence Section](#)

The Domestic Violence (DV) Section currently provides support for 4 programs and 98 projects statewide. These programs include an array of services for DV victims, focusing on prevention, counseling, and crises intervention as well as education and training. Funds are derived from State General Funds, and Federal Victims of Crime Act, Family Violence Prevention Program, and the Violence Against Women Act funds totaling \$17.4 million for FY 2008/09.

[Victim Witness Section](#)

The Victim Witness Section funds 58 Victim/Witness Assistance Centers legislatively mandated pursuant to Penal Code §13835 to provide services to meet the needs of both victims and witnesses of crime through the funding of local comprehensive centers for victim and witness assistance. The Victim/Witness Section currently funds 9 programs and 111 grants. Each program fosters a comprehensive approach to serving victims of crime and mandates collaboration by way of Memorandums of Understanding (MOU's). Current programs include: Victim/Witness Assistance; Elder Abuse Advocacy and Outreach, Special Emphasis Special Victims Office of the Attorney General, Victim Notification; McGeorge School of Law, Victims Legal Resource Center; Department of Corrections, Victim Services Communication Program/ Victim Services Enhancement; and Victim Services Training Institute. The diversity of the 111 grants currently funded includes state agencies, district attorney's, law enforcement, probation, and community-based organizations. These programs total \$22,820,016 in state and federal funding.

The Community Crisis Response Initiative was developed and implemented in response to large scale community crisis victimization incidents such as the Oklahoma City bombing, Columbine school shootings and the September 11th incident. This comprehensive plan is designed to improve systemic and community response, enhancement of existing services and the reduction of trauma experienced by victims. Currently, California has over 450 trained community crisis responders in the 58 Victim/Witness Assistance Centers and other allied agencies.

We are proud to be a part of a team that works for such talented and committed grant recipients that tirelessly serve all crime victims in California.



# Request for Proposal (RFP): The Competitive Grant Process

- A Request for Proposal (RFP) for a particular program is issued
- Grant Proposals are solicited from interested parties
- A panel of 3 or more raters examine each proposal and give it a score based on objective criteria
- *Funding is awarded to the selected agencies*



# Getting Started

- Read the entire RFP, particularly the sections about requirements for the type of grant you want (need).
  - Use the rating form, if available, as a guide in preparing proposal.
- Determine whether it is a new program, or enhancement of an existing program.
- Review the applicant checklist.



# Your Proposal Should Demonstrate:

- The unique and innovative aspects of your project that are above and beyond a run-of-the-mill program.
- The ability to support the overall intent, goals, and purpose of the program.
- A community problem that will be addressed by this grant.
- A feasible plan to address the problem.
- The ability of your organization to put the plan into effect.
- The ability to use the funds effectively and efficiently to carry out the mission.



# PROBLEM STATEMENT

- Relates to purpose and goals of the organization and works towards a solution.
- Target area and target population should be included.
- Support it with statistical evidence.
- Use testimony from experts, clients or beneficiaries.



# PROPOSED PLAN

- The plan should address the problems identified in the Problem Statement.
- Define the overall approach.
- Identify the goals and objectives to be achieved.
- Clearly describe the activities that will be conducted to support the achievement of the goals and objectives.



# IMPLEMENTATION

- Describe the organization and demonstrate its expertise to implement the plan.
- Clearly show how the proposed project fits within the organization.
- Demonstrate the qualifications of assigned staff. Include how the project-funded staff duties and time commitments support the proposed objectives and activities.
- Demonstrate supporting interagency partnerships.



# BUDGET

- Budget Narrative
  - Describe how the project's proposed budget supports the stated objectives and activities in the project.
  - Describe the duties of project-funded staff, including any qualifications or education level necessary.
  - Discuss the necessity of any subcontracts and any unusual expenditures.
- Budget Line Item
  - Must provide line item detail on all budgeted items (formula & justification).
  - Make sure that budgeted items directly support the objectives and activities of the grant.
  - Avoid unnecessary budget items that detract from the proposed plan.



# HELPFUL HINTS

- Review the instructions for writing the proposal.
  - Adhere to page limits for particular sections
  - Use a standard font like Times New Roman, or Arial
  - Use an 12 pt. font
  - Double spacing is preferred
- Complete and sign all forms and assurances.
- Remember to include all requested attachments.
- Use simple grammar.




