## Scholarship Notification

**Title:** Que Llueva Café Scholarship

**Funding Agency:** Chicano Organizing & Research in Education (CORE)

**Deadline:** Friday, February 25, 2011

**Award:** \$500

**Purpose:** CORE proudly sponsors this scholarship to help undocumented students continue on their academic path. This scholarship is a response to the lack of financial assistance provided to students, who do not have the legal documentation, that attend college in the United States. In particular, CORE seeks to support undocumented students that have met the rigorous academic requirements asked of them and hold the academic promise to achieve so much more.

### Eligibility:

- Must be of Chicano / Latino descent
- Must be an undocumented student. Undocumented student defined as someone who was born outside of the U.S. but lives here without the legal permission of the federal government.
- Must be or will be a high school/GED graduate who will enroll for the *first time* in an accredited college or university in the U.S. or Puerto Rico for the 2011-2012 academic year. Due to limited funds, students enrolled in college after they have graduated will not be considered.
- Must demonstrate financial need.
- Must demonstrate academic potential and promise.

### Application Components:

- One Letter of Recommendation – You may submit an extra letter but only one is required. We will only accept a maximum of 2 letters.
- Personal Statement (1000 words maximum) – Your personal statement must fulfill the following **three** things to be considered complete. Please read carefully.
  1. You must write a response to only one of the writing prompts below:  
Writing Prompts:
    - a. Provide an autobiography that includes your dreams, hopes, and aspirations.
    - b. How would you describe your high school experience and what do you expect to gain by enrolling in college?
    - c. What is your greatest motivation for attending college next year?
    - d. Chicana Feminist writer Ana Castillo writes, “We do not simply survive, that would imply that we were no more than drones. We live lives full with meaning.” Share with us how you live life full with meaning.

2. You must indicate in your personal statement that you are an undocumented student, defined as someone who was born outside of the U.S. but lives here without the legal permission of the federal government.
  3. You must include a description of your current financial need as an undocumented student in your personal statement.
- Copy of High School transcript – Submit your most current high school transcript. You may submit an unofficial or official transcript.
