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Preparedness Grant Programs

Purpose: Core assistance programs provide funds to build capabilities at the state and local levels.

Eligible Applicants: The State Administrative Agency (SAA) is the only entity eligible to apply for most preparedness grant funding.

(The California Emergency Management Agency-Cal EMA is the SAA for the state of California)

Awards: Funds are allocated and vary by program (competitive and non-competitive).



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Preparedness Grant Funding Supports:

- Planning
- Equipment
- Training
- Exercise
- Personnel
- Management and Administrative Costs
