HRSA

- Primary federal agency for improving access to health care services for people who are uninsured, isolated, or medically vulnerable

HRSA Goals

GOAL 1: Improve Access to Health Care.

GOAL 2: Improve Health Outcomes.

GOAL 3: Improve the Quality of Health Care.

GOAL 4: Eliminate Health Disparities.

GOAL 5: Improve the Public Health and Health Care Systems.

GOAL 6: Enhance the Ability of the Health Care System to Respond to Public Health Emergencies.

HRSA Budget

- HRSA budget: \$7.2 billion annually
- Additional \$2.5 billion under the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA)

HRSA Key Bureaus and Offices

- Bureau of Primary Health Care
- HIV/AIDS Bureau
- Maternal and Child Health Bureau
- Bureau of Health Professions
- Bureau of Clinician Recruitment and Service
- Healthcare Systems Bureau

Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC)

1,100 health center grantees

17 million medically underserved people

7,500 sites in urban and rural areas across
the nation

1 of every 18 people living in the U.S. relies
on a HRSA-funded clinic for primary care

HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB)

Administers the Ryan White Program (RWP)

Works with cities, states, and community-based organizations to provide HIV-related services

Over 529,000 people living with AIDS/HIV receive health care, treatment, and support services at a RWP facility

Medications through HRSA-supported State-run AIDS Drug Assistance programs (ADAP)

Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB)

Serves 34 million women, infants and children annually

About 60% of women who give birth receive services through HRSA- supported programs

HRSA supports 102 Healthy Start sites for women in areas with high infant mortality and provider shortages

Bureau of Health Professions (BHP)

Train health care professionals

Place graduates where most needed

**Grants support scholarship and loan
repayment programs at colleges and
universities**

**About 8,000 students graduate each year
from these HRSA-supported institutions**

**One in three works serving disadvantaged
populations**

Bureau of Clinician Recruitment and Service

**Administers the National Health Service
Corps (NHSC)**

**7,400 primary care clinicians nationwide in
2010**

Compare with 4,800 in 2009

**Sites are located in and providing service to
a federally designated Health
Professional Shortage Area (HPSA)**

**HRSA provides loan repayment and
scholarship programs for physicians and
nurses**

Healthcare Systems Bureau

Operates 340B Drug Pricing Program

Gives safety-net providers access to discounted pharmaceuticals

About 14,000 safety net providers participate in the program

Gives access to discount drug purchases often 20-50% below wholesale

Saves between \$1.5 -\$2 billion annually

HRSA and ARRA (Stimulus Bill)

\$2 billion for Community Health Centers

\$500 million for service delivery

\$1.5 billion for Capital Improvements

\$300 million for NHSC

\$200 million for health professions training

HRSA and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

**Community Health Centers: \$11 billion, 5
years:**

\$9.5 billion for new sites

\$1.5 billion for Capital Improvements

**Double number of patients seen by health
centers to nearly 40 million**

HRSA and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

NHSC Funding

FY 2011: \$290 million

FY 2012: \$295 million

FY 2013: \$300 million

FY 2014: \$305 million

FY 2015: \$310 million

HRSA and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

Nurse Managed Health Centers

Funding for community-based clinical sites administered by advance practice nurses

Teaching Health Center Grants

FY 2011 – 2016: \$230 million

HRSA and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

Patient Navigator and Chronic Diseases Outreach Grant

\$5 million in FY 2010 to fund community workers trained to assist patients and families in managing chronic conditions such as diabetes and cancer

HRSA and Affordable Care Act (ACA)

Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program

FY 2010: \$100 million

Funding to States

Provide home visitation services

**Improve outcomes for children and
families who reside in at-risk
communities**

**Collaborate with Administration for
Children and Families (ACF)**
